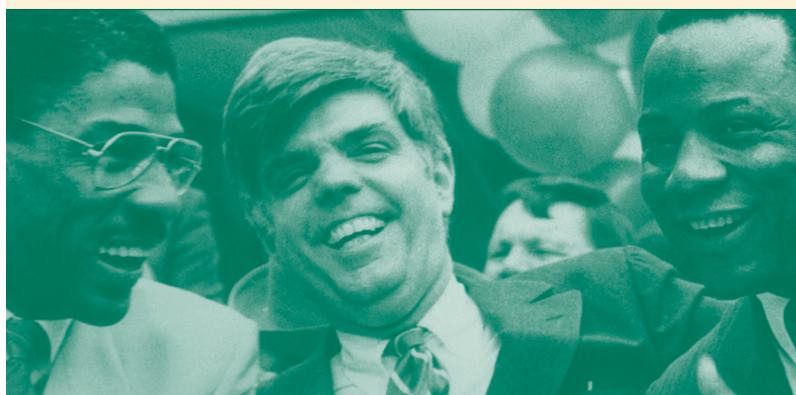


AN EXTRAORDINARY LEGACY OF SERVICE AND VISION
